Betty Kraft is leaving for Indiana for several months to be with her daughter. She plans to do some touring in Canada.



the Vice President reports

As chairman of the BOD committee on fund raising a situation has arisen which needs addressing. There are several ramifications which present themselves in our consideration for soliciting funds from members for whatever purpose. While the motive might be perfectly honorable, the Board must consider many factors in such requests. First, and foremost, TOTH is certified by the IRS as 501c3 non-profit. Should any solicited funds from members of such an organization accrue to a limited group, this in itself would be suspicious of for a profit. TOTH cannot serve as a "pass through" for any such funds. Should any suspicion of such were to come to light, the consequences would be disastrous since the City of Cedar Park would then be obligated to re-think their relationship with TOTH. Secondly, the information we were presented with had no mention of costs, methodology, benefits, number of members involved, in short not even the most basic information on which to make an informed decision. In short ANY requests for funds, fund raising, etc., MUST come through the Board together will all pertinent financial, benefit, mission statements and all relevant information in order for the Board to make an informed decision. The proper protocol is for any such group, wishing to raise funds by any manner, is as follows: All documentation should be provided to the chairman of Fund Raising at least 10 days prior to the Executive Committee meeting. At this time a decision will be made to request further information, ask the Executive Committee their input, or forward to the full Board for action. We wish to avoid any future instances where the long range mission and stability of TOTH might become compromised.

The annual Garage/Bake sale on October 16 is proceeding apace and we are looking for volunteers to get their thinking caps on as to items and goodies for this event.


The contract with Fern Bluff MUD has been cancelled.





Update on Memorial Garden

The Grounds Committee is grinding to a halt with the final work performed in July and August during the extreme heat and dry weather we have had.

In July Dick Planck and I obtained landscape timbers, Dillo dirt and other supplies, along with a pickup load of black mulch (donated by Jacobs Landscaping Co. of Cedar Park), plus a load of large river gravel.

Ken Birdwell and I put down the timbers and filled them with gravel to keep out the weeds on the two ramps leading to entrances to TOTH on the east side and park side, dressing up the entrances that previously featured only weeds.

The final landscaping touches to the Memorial Garden featured four large limestone rocks on the park side of the lawn with landscape timbers bordering them and gravel added inside the border with a red yucca plant in the center. The stones were a donation from Brad Adams of Leander, an Elder of Hill Country Bible Church of Leander, who hauled and installed the rocks with heavy equipment as a donation to TOTH. Dillo dirt has been spread over the other grassy areas of the building adjacent to the parking lot, in addition to gravel added to the rock garden and additional mulch to areas planted with shrubs and flowers.


Mary Richie had a wonderful time at her 47th Class Reunion. We heard that she was the first on the dance floor and the last to leave. Don't doubt that at all!


