Income for April was \$4,815.54 and expenses were \$3,536.94 resulting in a net gain of \$1,278.60. Income was higher than usual due to a \$1,000 donation from PEC. One of TOTH's sources of income are the monies received from River Place for deed restriction inspection. Several of our members donate their time monthly to driving and checking for violations. There are daytime and nighttime shifts and River Place is going to perform the daytime shifts with their inhouse personnel. This means a loss of income to TOTH of \$500 per month. Deed Restrictions Inspections VOLUNTEERS

We have recently read in the Gazette about TOTH's need for more volunteers. This should be a reminder that our Center will always be depending on our member volunteers since we receive no funding from any government or private organization. For several years we have received \$500/Mo. for making two daytime inspections/month at River Place. As of May 1st our daytime inspections contract was cancelled; however, we still have the agreement to make a night-time inspection once per month. This is a very demanding chore and I want to thank Ken Birdwell for taking on the responsibility for this task.

Also, many thanks to John and Irene Berkel, Herb and Pat Zwernemann and my wife Myra for working with me over the last few years to make these inspections; therefore, helping to generate a steady revenue flow for TOTH. You are excellent "role models" for our other TOTH members to emulate.





Thermostat Covers Installed





The following are highlights from the September 12th Board of Directors meeting:

• Aaron W. Games, PLLC, made a preliminary auditor's report at the Board Meeting. The final report was to be given to Lois Birdwell later in that week. Basically, he found no fraud or inappropriate

- procedures. However, he did have some questions on clarifications and procedure issues to resolve with Lois. He also will provide some suggestions on accounting procedures.

 - 2. Contact a current member of the organization who has experience in fund raising to begin this important effort immediately under the current By-Law Chairman, Vice President, Paul Jaqua. By-Law changes will be voted on in this up and coming election to change the By-Laws to have a Fund Raising Committee Chairman nominated and approved by the Board.
- <u>Building Maintenance</u> Paul Jaqua had maintenance done on the refrigerator including adding Freon. This is the second time in the past few months that we have had expenses on the refrigerator. Paul is going to investigate if we can obtain a donation from a supplier or business. Ken Birdwell replaced the blinds in the Game Room.
- New Business Frank Mignoli agreed to serve as chef/cook for the Halloween Party scheduled for Sunday, October 30th at 5:30 pm. Dinner will consist of lasagna, Italian salad and bread with banana splits. Cost is \$7 member and \$8 non-members. Costumes will be welcomed. 50's 60's is the theme.



Income for August was \$2,882.55 and expenses were \$2,640.92 resulting in a net gain of \$241.63. Income for Sept was \$2,499.31 and expenses were \$5,143.45 resulting in a net loss of \$2,644.14. \$2,114.00 of the loss in Sept. was due to an annual expense for Fire and BOD insurance. TOTH has lost two sources of income this year. There have been several comments from members that we don't need to charge for meals or leftovers because we have "lots of money" in the bank. We are beginning to use those excess funds for operating expenses starting in October 2011. I will be working on a projected budget to forecast how long the funds will last and will present it to the BOD.
