Our income for November was \$2,069.49 and our expenses were \$3,544.29 resulting in a loss of \$1,474.80. Most of this loss was due to the payment of \$1,173.00 for the annual premium for Liability Insurance. Our income for the year has exceeded our expenses by \$2,633.55 so we should complete the year with a small surplus.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE – FEBRUARY, 2014

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In my message to you last month, I indicated that I would propose a few suggestions to streamline our operation. Those suggestions would be designed to help us achieve our objectives of increased participation by our membership and greater public awareness of what we do. These proposals were presented to the Board at its meeting of January 13, 2014.

The first proposal requires a change in the bylaws. It would replace the standing committee known as the Fund Raising Committee with a Special Events and Resource Development Committee, chaired by the Board Vice President. It would be populated by the chairs of all Special Events sub-committees, as well as the Chair of a newly established Publicity and Public Awareness sub-Committee. This model will increase communications to and from the Board and the sub-committees, while each of the special events sub-committees will operate as separate entities.

The proposal was unanimously approved by the Board and the proposed revised bylaw amendment is published in this edition of the Gazette. Final vote will be taken at our next membership meeting on Monday, February 17th. Please plan to attend.

Also included in this edition is a brief description of the Publicity and Public Awareness sub-committee.

Wednesday, January 15th was our first Soup Day of the New Year. While we had to delay it a week, it was a great success. Chef Lou Hosek's homemade pea soup was delicious, made even better with Frank Mignoli's corn bread. A sing-along put the icing on the cake. Thanks, Lou and Frank, and all the volunteers who made it a fun event. Frank had such a good time, he's volunteered to Chair the Soup Committee this year. The next soup day is Wednesday, February 12.

It's a relatively easy task to set goals and objectives, but to accomplish them it takes commitment from a lot of volunteers. As you know, TOTH is volunteer



driven and we need folks to step up to chair and serve on our committees. If you have an interest in the Senior Expo or Publicity and Public Awareness, please contact Brenda, me or any member of the Board.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Our income for December was \$2,770.88 and expenses were \$2,229.49 resulting in an income of \$541.39. For the year 2013 we had income of \$34,500.28 and ex-penses of \$31,405.34 resulting in an income of \$3,174.94.

During the year 2013, \$2,186.00 was donated in memory of departed members. This money will be transferred to the Memorial Endowment Investment account.

A brief overview of 2013 finances and 2014 budget will be presented at the February 17th covered dish luncheon and Business Meeting..

YOUR DUES ARE DUE BY FEBRUARY 15TH !

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO TOTH BYLAWS – Article VII, Section 2(C)

Current: "The Fund Raising Committee shall consist of at least three (3) members. The Chairperson of the Committee shall be selected and approved in January of each year by the Board of Directors. The chairperson of the committee shall nominate two other members of the committee for approval by the Board of Directors. The Fund Raising Committee shall be responsible for developing plans and implementing procedures to advance the purposes of TOTH through fund raising activities."

Proposed Amendment: "The Special Events and Resource Development Committee shall consist of at least five (5) members. The Vice President of the Board of Directors shall be the Chairperson of the Committee. The Vice President shall nominate other members to serve as Chairs of Special Events sub-committees such as the Ground Hog Bash, Game Day and Senior Expo, for approval by the Board of Directors. Also serving on the committee shall be the Chair of the Publicity and Public Awareness committee, which will provide marketing and promotional support for the events. The Chairs of the Special events will recruit other members of TOTH to assist in promoting and implementing their activities. The Committee shall also be responsible for developing plans and implementing procedures to advance the purposes of TOTH through other fund raising activities."

PUBLICITY AND PUBLIC AWARENESS COMMITTEE

The Publicity and Public Awareness Committee shall be responsible to generate awareness of TOTH in the news media and outlets that are read and/or frequented by its target audiences. This committee will publicize all TOTH activities to its membership and other interested constituencies.

To effectively execute this function the committee shall:

- Develop and utilize an e-mail list to make announcements. Make sure these are posted two times. Once a few days before the event and either the day before or on the day of the event.
- Establish media list and send out News Releases highlighting special events and unique activities.
- Make special announcements as requested by other committees or officers.
- Maintain contact with the Vice President as to the specifics of the program
- Have members of the committee or the Board make special announcements at all TOTH activities.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE – SEPTEMBER, 2014

I want to take this month's column to outline what I perceive to be the three main issues facing the Senior Center, while describing a plan to address one of those issues.

1. Loss of Membership by attrition. As an organization serving an aging population, not much can done about that

2. <u>The need for volunteer involvement by</u> <u>members</u>. Many participate in activities, but do not assist in setting up and/or staying after to clean up

3. <u>Lack of Visibility.</u> Countless members have told me they would have joined sooner if they had known we were here.

I believe lack of visibility, both internal and external is a major issue. People don't know who we are or what we do. To address this problem, here's what we're doing so far






