COVID-19 UPDATE

COVID-19 Cases and Vaccinations

We have quickly moved from Stage 5 to Stage 2 of Risk of COVID-19 in Austin. Is the pandemic over? Some people think so.

In Area O, the parameter of 7-day average number of daily new hospital patients as of March 16 was <25 at 17 new COVID hospital patients daily or Stage 3. Area O consists of 11 counties including Travis and Williamson counties. These two largest counties represent 75% of the population of the 11 counties. Based on this these two counties could be in Stage 2, while the whole 11 counties are in Stage 3.

Another parameter to determine the stage of risk is the Community Transmission Rate (CTR). It is measured using the 7-day daily average of new cases divided by the result of dividing the total population of the community by 100,000. As of March 16th Travis and Williamson County values were @ 19.4 and 16.9 respectively. Travis County and Williamson County are in Stage 3 based on this parameter, but well on their way to Stage 2.

Total membership has dropped significantly since the pandemic to about 10% more than 2011. The percentage of Cedar Park residents has remained the same at around 59% and basically the percentage distribution has not changed much since February 2019.
