## **TREASURER'S REPORT**

April income was \$2,988, expenses were \$6,595, which includes a one time cost of \$2,000 to clean carpets and chairs. Investments increased by \$2,636. Note: if Congress doesn't do something in the next week to avoid defaulting on our country's debt, I would expect the stock market to react and the value of our investments could drop significantly.

Speaking of debts and deficits.....TOTH's projected income for this year is approximately \$40,000, while our projected expenses are \$57,000. Shortfalls are due to inflation, lower membership, and added costs. The Board of Directors is looking at ways of increasing income and decreasing costs, which may include an increase in dues next year. Shortfalls in this year's budget will be covered by withdrawals from our investment fund. Please pass on any ideas for new fundraisers to any member of the Board.






