October Expenses: \$3,852. There were no unusual expenses in October (Christmas lights installation deposit of \$400 was reimbursed from the Memorial Fund account).

Investment account decreased \$7,099; Memorial account decreased \$1,815; additional decrease of \$1,914 was moved to checking for Memorial expenses.




