TAX SERVICES

The Treasure of the Hills Senior Center has partnered with AARP (American Association of Retired People) Foundation Tax-Aide to provide federal tax preparation help to anyone, free of charge. The focus is on taxpayers who are over 50 and have low to moderate income.

Why TOTH Partnered with AARP Foundation Tax -Aide

AARP Tax-Aide is the largest free, volunteer-based tax assistance and preparation program in the U.S. There is no need to be a member of AARP or the Senior Center for this free service. The U.S. tax code is complicated. As a result, many taxpayers overpay, turn to services they can't afford, or don't file — missing out on credits and deductions they've earned. AARP volunteers will help you obtain the highest refund to which you are legally entitled. They are trained and IRS-certified every year to make sure they understand the latest changes to the tax code.

When Will this Service be Available?
The Senior Center will be hosting AARP
Foundation Tax-Aide volunteers on Wednesdays
in February (and part of March if necessary).

How Do I Obtain this Service? It is just a two step process.

- 1. Call 512-333-0471 to make an appointment to meet at the Center with a Tax-Aide volunteer to prepare your taxes. You will be given additional information then and your questions will be answered.
- 2. Return to the Center to review and sign your completed return.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Total income for December \$5,245 Total expenses for December \$4,868

As expected, the investment account gained \$14,904 in December. That is about a \$30,000 gain during the last two months, which is typically matched by a similar loss in the first quarter. But overall good gains for 2023.

For the year total income was \$50,762 vs. budgeted income of \$40,723.

Expenses for the year were right on plan at \$57,215 actual vs. \$57,352 budgeted.

Personal Safety

- Keep family and friends informed of basic information on how to find you such as Where, When, Who, and How Long.
- The adage "There is safety in numbers" is true.

- Go out in pairs or groups whenever possible.
- Communicate the message that you are calm, confident and know where you are going! Stand tall, walk with purpose, and make eye contact with people around you.
- Familiarize yourself with the route to and from your intended destinations. Look at maps, know the cross-streets and surrounding landmarks familiar to most.
- Be aware of your surroundings! Look to see who is in front of you and behind you. If you are concerned about your safety, ask a friend to accompany you.
- Take different routes to recurring destinations so people cannot chart your routine.
- Trust your instincts! If you feel uncomfortable in a place or situation, simply leave.
- If you need to draw attention, yell "FIRE" as loud as you can repeatedly. People respond to the word "fire" more often and more quickly than they do to "help".
- You and your loved ones are your most prized possessions. Replaceable items are not worth your life. Do not engage attackers stealing property. Call '911."
- Consider investing in self-defense classes and defensive items such as pepper spray, and do practice drills. The more comfortable you are with these things, the better prepared you will be.

On The Street When Walking Alone

- Walk only on busy, well-lighted streets, even if it makes the trip a little longer.
- Bring a walking stick, umbrella, golf club, or long handled flashlight you can use as a weapon if necessary.
- If using earphones to listen to music, use only one earpiece, enabling you to still hear surrounding sounds.
- Carry your cell phone when walking or jogging.
- Avoid shortcuts such as parking lots, alleys, open fields, and wooded areas.
- Carry no more money or credit cards than you absolutely need.
