
In March, the three Bradford Pear trees on the south side of the Center had to be removed. The roots had begun to interfere with the water line, causing a water leak. Bradford Pear trees are fast growing, but short-lived. One of the trees was already dying. Rather than planting new trees, the City of Cedar Park has allotted \$1500 for planters, soil, and plants.

The City also extended the railings to the handicap parking spaces and installed a new water heater on the kitchen side of the building, replacing the 30-year-old model.

The City will also be replacing the exterior door to the great room on the east side of the building where the ramp is.

Have you noticed the new flowers in the planters and the bluebonnets in the beds? The Texas Primroses and the red yucca in the round bed by the shed are blooming. Spring is here!

When at Home Alone

- Keep doors and windows locked even when you are at home.
- Check who is at the door before opening it, and do not open the door to an unexpected visitor.
- If someone comes to your door asking to use the phone to call a mechanic or the police, keep the door locked and make the call yourself.
- Ask for photo identification and credentials from any salesperson who requests entry to your home. Ask that their ID be pushed under the door. Many professional burglars use this cover to check out homes. If you are doubtful, check with the person's office before letting him or her in.
- If you return home and you suspect forced entry, DON'T GO IN! Call the police to help you check the house.
- Dogs are good deterrents to burglars. Burglars do not like to have attention drawn. Be aware that trained guard dogs do not make good pets. Coming in May: Tips for "When You Are Away ."

APRIL HONOREE—DICK PLANCK, TOTH's "Numbers Man"



This month, we honor Dick Planck, a 30-year member and long-time treasurer for TOTH. Dick is credited with modernizing the group's accounting system and for convincing the board to create the center's successful investment program.

One day in 1994, Dick and his late wife, Dodie, realized that someone was moving furniture into the vacant building at 408 Ridgewood in the newly annexed Buttercup Creek subdivision of Cedar Park. Turns out, TOTH was coming to the neighborhood.

The house had originally been a home, but later became the office for the Buttercup Creek Municipal Utility District (MUD). When Cedar Park annexed the subdivision, the MUD was dissolved and the building vacated. The Treasure of the Hills Senior Center board was looking for a building and this one seemed a good fit. Then, in 1994, the City and TOTH came to an agreement to and volunteers were moving in when Dick and Dodie discovered them.

"One day, we noticed some activity, so we walked over and introduced ourselves," Dick remembers. "One of the first people we met was Lois Carlson who manned the reception desk for years." Dick and Dodie liked the people they met and liked the idea of a place where local seniors



could gather to socialize and build relationships.

Dick's first volunteer work involved landscaping and grounds work. "I helped spread dirt and placed rocks in key places," he notes, peeking out a window to see if some of the rocks are still there. They are. Dick was also involved in additions to the building, including the Great Room and later the TV Room.

Dodie was an active volunteer also, editing the Gazette from the beginning. She had edited a newsletter for the Buttercup Creek subdivision before the



annexation. "Some of the folks knew about her experience," Dick says, "And so she started a newsletter for TOTH."

Dick remembers that activities, in those days, included bridge, canasta, exercises, quilting, potluck lunches and pinochle. "I played pinochle," he says with a grin.

An electrical engineer by profession, Dick had an affinity for organization and also possessed excellent computer skills. When he was elected treasurer of TOTH, he put those skills to work. "I set up spreadsheets and reports so the board could easily tell what was happening with our finances," he notes.

He also convinced the board to start investing some of the center's funds. "We started with money market funds and from there it grew," he explains. Currently TOTH has a substantial investment fund thanks to the encouragement from Dick.

Dick can't recall exactly how long he was treasurer of TOTH, but he is sure it was more than 20 years. "Dodie and I did a lot of work for TOTH over the years," he recalls, "but we also had a lot of fun."

"Dick was a major influence on TOTH's financial health," says current TOTH President Ellen Fannin, "But his real value to us has been and continues to the foundation he laid for our financial security. We are extremely grateful to Dick for his dedication and devotion to the well-being of TOTH."
