We are incredibly grateful for the unwavering support the City of Cedar Park extends to Treasure of the Hills in numerous ways.

The most obvious means of support is the building where we are housed. The City not only owns the building and provides it to us free of charge, but they take care of all the maintenance and, as of last budget cycle, also pay our utilities.

The City's Parks & Recreation Department works closely with us on certain events. They have co-hosted three Puzzler Party events. They furnished bus travel for two day trips, the Painted Churches trip last September and the Wine Tour in April. We are working on another two or three trips in the Fall. There will be more information coming soon on these trips.

The Parks & Rec Department is also providing the entire Rec Center for the Senior Expo in October free of charge. This is allowing us to expand what we offer at our major fundraiser and we will have ample parking for attendees.

However, that is not the only help the City is providing with the Senior Expo. The Communications & Engagement Department are providing assistance to our event by producing the program for us and helping with publicity and marketing. We were recently featured in the City's e-Newsletter, the Pulse, in an article and video about the TOTH and the GenLink students who come on a monthly basis to help with technology questions. 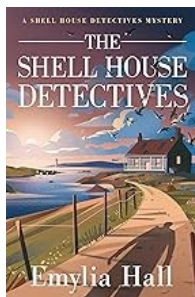

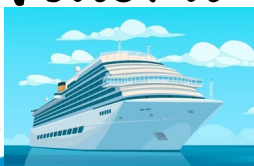

Constable's Corner ★

As we dive into grilling season, let's discuss a vital safety topic: gas leaks.

Whether you're firing up your grill for a backyard BBQ or just enjoying a cozy evening outside, it's crucial to be aware of the dangers that gas leaks can pose.

Remember these safety tips:

1. Check for leaks: Before using your grill, inspect the hose and connections for any signs of damage or wear. A simple soap and water solution can help identify leaks – if you see bubbles, you have a problem!
2. Keep the area well-ventilated: Always grill outdoors in an open space. It helps prevent gas accumulation and reduces the risk of fire or explosion.
3. Know the signs of a gas leak: If you smell gas (a rotten egg odor), hear a hissing noise, or notice dead plants around your grill, take immediate action—shut off the gas, leave the area, and call for help.
4. Store propane tanks safely: Keep your propane tanks upright, in a cool, dry place, and away from direct sunlight. Let's keep our grilling fun and safe! Share this post to spread awareness and ensure everyone enjoys delicious meals without the dangers of gas leaks!

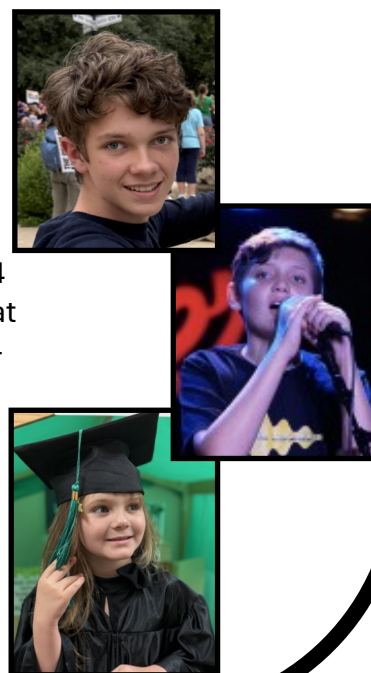


Photo Gallery: Mother's Day Tea Luncheon
